International Association of Women Police Announce Recipients of 2017 Annual Recognition Programme.

The International Association of women Police, I.A.W.P. are pleased to announce the 2017 recipients of our Annual Recognition Programme, all of whom will be honoured at a formal luncheon during the IAWP's 55th Annual Training Conference due to take place between 17th and 21st September 2017, in Cairns, Australia.

Each year the I.A.W.P. receives nominations from across the globe for women in policing who are deserving of recognition for their contribution to policing and to their local communities. This year, for the first time, we also received nominations for men to be considered for our new 'male award in support of HeForShe'. It will recognise a male officer or male civilian employed by a Law Enforcement Agency or Police Force, who has made a significant contribution and commitment to the advancement of women in policing. The quality of the nominations creates a very difficult task for the selection committee, and 2017 again provided the committee with a real challenge in choosing the recipient in each category.

IAWP President Margaret Shorter, "IAWP has, for the past 100 years, promoted the role of women in policing, championing change to enable women to play their full part in delivering an inclusive service to local communities. Our belief is that women need to be recognised for their contribution, without our annual recognition programme some phenomenal women, and men, would go unrecognized for their efforts".
